

Common Culprits for Slow Internet and What to Do About Them

It's frustrating when a webpage takes forever to load or a video stops to buffer, displaying the famed "spinning wheel of death." Here are some common reasons why an internet connection may be moving at slower-than-expected speeds, along with actions you can take to help rectify the issues.

An Increase in Users and Devices

The more people online at once, the slower the connection gets. For example, if you have several houseguests on your home's Wi-Fi network, you may notice a temporary decrease in internet speeds during their visit. This can also be an ongoing issue if your family size has increased or the number of internet-connected devices and bandwidth-heavy applications have risen significantly. In the case of the latter, it may be time for an upgrade of your internet plan.



Spyware and Viruses

Spyware and viruses could be the culprits causing your internet connection to slow down on your computer. Consider running a full system scan with your antivirus program to see if there are any suspicious programs that need to be removed.

Walls and Floors Blocking Wi-Fi Signals

The construction materials in your home can greatly affect wireless communication speed and range. Materials such as concrete, brick, and metal can make it difficult to connect and can slow your network speed or even completely block wireless signals from reaching certain parts of your home. Large furniture items such as filing cabinets or bookshelves, as well as appliances like stoves or refrigerators, can also interfere with Wi-Fi. You may be able to solve the problem simply by moving your router to a different location.

An Old Router

Some older routers have a speed cap limiting the maximum internet speed possible, which means your outdated router may be preventing you from receiving the full speed of your internet plan. One of the best ways to make sure your home's Wi-Fi network is as fast and reliable as possible is to buy a new router that supports the current 802.11ac standard, which can effectively handle 20 or more devices.



There are Downsides to Cutting the Cable Cord

Despite the streaming service options now available, the vast majority of Americans still have cable TV service. What's more, some who have tried cutting the cord have been disappointed in the experience and returned to cable TV.

What are the downsides of cutting the cable cord? Here are the major ones:

- Not all programming is available on streaming. Some of your favorite shows or channels may be missing if you rely entirely on streaming services. This is particularly true for highly popular programs from premium channels.
- You will probably need to pay for multiple streaming services. For example, to get something even close to the programming you want, you may have to subscribe to three or four services. In addition to the costs involved, this also means the hassle of dealing with multiple companies.
- You often have to wait to watch a program. Some streaming services must wait until
 a television show has completed its season's run before it can have a title for streaming,
 meaning it might be a year before you can watch. Other services may delay the availability
 of a program anywhere from one day to a full week after it airs on traditional TV.
- Diehard sports fan may want to think twice. That is particularly true for NFL fans
 that simply must watch the games in real time. To do that, you need access to local
 cable channels, since the NFL Game Rewind streaming service offers only games that
 have already been played.

The bottom line is this: Research carefully and think about all the issues before making a change. You may decide that cable TV service is still the best choice for you.







Here's How to Safely Clean All Your Electronics

Electronics are dust magnets, so it's important to clean them regularly to avoid dust buildup that can block important components like fans and lead to overheating. Below are general guidelines for safely cleaning most electronic surfaces. Consult manufacturer instructions for more specific recommendations.

- Computers and Laptops Dust large areas with a microfiber cloth or a mitt. Use a
 soft, small (clean) paintbrush to dust keys and small crevices. Canned air also works
 well to dislodge dust and other small debris that can be difficult to remove. Depending
 on your manufacturer's suggestion, you can most likely use a barely damp microfiber
 or screen-safe cloth to effectively clean the screen. Do not use paper towels on your
 screens, since they can scratch and pit the surface.
- Televisions Since there are so many different types of TV screens around, you'll
 want to follow manufacturer instructions for cleaning yours. Not doing so may void any
 warranty or damage your picture. For routine dusting, use a microfiber wand duster or
 microfiber cloth, moving from top to bottom.
- Cell Phones and Tablets Remove any cases and covers. Wipe with a barely damp
 microfiber cloth and/or a screen wipe to effectively clean and disinfect. Wipe any keys
 or frequently touched areas with a cotton pad with rubbing alcohol or an alcohol wipe
 to disinfect surfaces. Make sure you don't get any part of the devices wet.
- Remotes and Controllers Use a cotton pad with rubbing alcohol or an alcohol wipe
 to disinfect surfaces. If you have pesky crevices, use a cotton swab or toothpick to
 dislodge debris.

In addition, be sure to keep food or drinks away from your electronics to avoid potentially damaging spills.



The Better Business Bureau warns consumers to beware of the following:

- Fake shipping notifications: Scammers send emails pretending to be from companies like UPS or FedEx with links to package tracking information.
 Don't click on any links or open any attachments coming from a questionable source (typos and grammatical mistakes are red flags).
- Phony charities: Scammers take advantage of the holiday spirit of generosity with fake charity solicitations in emails and on social media. Check out charities at give.org before donating.
- Temporary holiday jobs: Retailers and delivery services need extra help at the holidays, but beware of solicitations requiring you to share personal information or pay for a job lead. Apply in person or go to retailers' main websites.
- Free gift cards: Pop-up ads or email offering free gift cards are often just a ploy to get your personal information for identity theft.
- Social media gift exchange: It sounds great—buy one gift and get 36 in return. But it's a variation on an illegal pyramid scheme.
